Facts relating to the above entitled appeal were determined by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction at a meeting held at the State Superintendent's direction by Robert C. Van Raalte, Assistant Superintendent of the Department of Public Instruction, and Max C. Ashwill, Attorney and Legal Consultant for the Department of Public Instruction, on March 3, 1969, at the Hortonville Public Schools.

The following appears from information secured at said meeting held March 3, 1969, at Hortonville Public Schools.

That on February 17, 1969, the School Board of the Hortonville Joint School District No. 1 held a special meeting and voted to expel Rodney Manual from school

for the remainder of the school year.

Said special board meeting held February 17, 1969, was called by telephone notice and all of the school board members were present at the meeting on the expulsion of Rodney Manager except Mr. Floyd Meyer.

That such absent member did not in writing consent to such special meeting as required by Section 120.11 (2), Wisconsin Statutes.

Conclusions

That the action of the Hortonville School Board to expel Rodney Manual at a meeting not called as required by statute would be ineffective. See <u>Kleimenhagen</u> vs. Dixon, 122 Wis. 526.

There being no valid expulsion of Rodney M from the Hortonville Community Schools, said Rodney M is entitled to be reinstated therein and therefore it is ordered that the Hortonville School Board forthwith readmit Rodney M to the Hortonville High School.
