WISCONSIN 2021 YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEY (YRBS) GUIDE TO OPTIONAL MODULES AND PILOT QUESTIONS

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OPTIONAL MODULE INSTRUCTIONS

All Wisconsin schools taking the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) utilize a standard survey. Upon registration for the YRBS, there is also the ability to customize a survey by adding one or two optional modules. Use this guide as a reference to understand and decide upon optional module(s). Then use the online registration form to make your selection.

Why optional modules?

All of the topic areas in these optional modules <u>are</u> included in the standard surveys. However, the optional modules provide more depth in a specific area. Before deciding to add an optional module, please review the standard survey; it may already contain the questions you need. Some schools may select an optional module because it includes questions that are needed to fulfill a grant requirement. The Drug Free Communities module is specifically written to fulfill the data requirements of that federal grant, although other schools may also use that module.

Deciding on an optional module or modules:

- It is highly recommended that schools collaborate with their local health department, CESA, or
 other local YRBS stakeholders to ensure that schools' use of optional modules within an area
 meets local data needs.
- Best practice is to keep the survey as short as possible. If you do not need to include an
 optional module for school or local grant requirements or other initiatives, it is best not to add
 it.
- If an optional module is added, it is advised to only add one.
- Schools are allowed to add up to two of the four optional modules. That accommodation was
 made in 2021 for places that have multiple grants and therefore need questions that appear in
 two different modules. Note that adding two modules may mean that more students need
 extra time to complete the survey.
- In addition to the two optional modules, middle schools are allowed to use the "mini module" which includes four (4) demographic or subgroup questions that already appear on the high school survey and which are helpful for breaking down the results.

OPTIONAL MODULE 1: DRUG FREE COMMUNITIES

What to know before registering for this module:

- Best practice is to use the shortest survey that meets your school and community's needs.
- Even without this module, the standard high school and middle school surveys will include questions related to use of drugs, alcohol, and tobacco products.
- This module contains questions that fulfill the core measures of the federal Drug Free Communities (DFC) grant, and which are not already included on the standard high school and middle school YRBS surveys.
- For this example document, questions are numbered 1-13. On the actual survey, optional modules are added to the end of the standard high school or middle school version.

- Best practice is to use the shortest survey that meets your school and community's needs.
- Even without adding this module, the standard high school and middle school surveys include questions on use of tobacco products, including vaping.
- This module expands on the number of tobacco-related questions. Questions in this
 module were supplied by Wisconsin's Department of Health Services Youth Tobacco
 Prevention program and are used on the Youth Tobacco Survey. This modules also adds a
 question to the middle school survey that otherwise only appears in the high school YRBS.
- For this example document, questions are numbered For this example document, questions are numbered 1-10 for high schools, and 1-11 for middle schools. On the actual survey, optional modules are added to the end of the standard high school or middle school version.

OPTIONAL MODULE 3: ADVERSITY AND PROTECTIVE FACTORS

What to know before registering for this module:

- Best practice is to use the shortest survey that meets your school and community's needs.
- Even without adding this module, the standard high school and middle school surveys include questions on adverse events, stressors and protective factors.
- This module expands on the general area of adversity, stress, and protective factors. Note that there are more questions in this module at the middle school level (n=12) than the high school level (n=10), because this module adds two questions for middle school respondents that are already present on the standard WI high school survey.
- For this example document, questions are numbered 1-10 for high schools and 1-12 for ndard

middle schools. On the actual survey, optional modules are added to the end of the stan high school or middle school version.

- Even without adding this module, the standard high school and middle school surveys include questions on school climate.
- This module expands on the area of school climate. The module draws from questions on the Department of Education School Climate Survey and the Safe and Supportive Schools (S3) cluster of Wisconsin's previous OnlineYRBS system. The Safe and Supportive Schools cluster was used extensively in the previous Online YRBS system. Some of the questions have been modified slightly for clarity.
- For this example document, questions are numbered 1-10. On the actual survey, optional modules are added to the end of the standard high school or middle school version.

PILOT QUESTIONS

During the registration process, schools or those registering on a school's behalf will be asked whether or not to include pilot questions. The two pilot demographic questions on race and sex are intended to allow for more selections than appear on the standard survey, while still staying as close to the standard survey as possible.

Pilot demographic questions are not available for the approximately 2,000 students sampled into the CDC/DPI State of Wisconsin sample. Schools that have sampled classrooms can administer the pilot questions to other classrooms, and DPI works with those schools to ensure that the appropriate version of the survey is routed to each classroom.

PILOT SEX QUESTION

Here is the standard question:

If a student leaves the standard sex question blank, no further prompts appear.

Here is the pilot question:

2. What is your sex? (Leave blank if neither)
O A. Female
O B. Male

If a student leaves the pilot question blank, then the prompt below appears:

You did not select either male or female. How would you
describe your sex? (You may leave blank if you wish.)

Since this is a pilot question with an open-ended text option, it remains to be seen whether the responses from students who do not choose either male or female will generate usable categories of data. If the data is usable in resulting reports, categories will be subject to standard data redaction policies to protect student privacy.

PILOT RACE QUESTION

The standard race question allows students to select more than one race. The pilot version expands on this by also including an "Other:_____" option, which allows students to enter a response into the text box.

Since this is a pilot question with an open-ended text option, it remains to be seen whether the responses from students who write in a response will generate usable categories of data. If the data is usable in resulting reports, categories will be subject to standard data redaction policies to protect student privacy.

OPEN-ENDED QUESTION (on some surveys only)

An open-ended feedback question is asked of a <u>small number of randomly selected students</u> and allows students to provide comments on the survey itself or any topic area. The 2019 results to this question were helpful in understanding both the survey user experience and some of the issues facing young people. Information gathered through the 2019 open-ended question prompted changes to the 2021 survey.

By selecting "yes" to including this question, schools allow that at least one of their students, and no more than a few, may have this question included on the survey. The results are not available at the school level but do help with the continuous quality improvement of the YRBS in Wisconsin and provide insight into what is important to young people.
