



# Discipline Reporting

- Reports due May 1, 2013
- Combined suspensions & expulsions carried out as of March 31, 2013
- Grades 9-12 enrollment
- Complete survey tool with this information

# YRBS Requirements

- All 2013 surveys must be done using OYRBS
- Sites can create new surveys or copy their 2012 surveys in 2013
- YRBS window: February 1- April 30, 2013
  - Surveys can be created now
  - Data collection must occur in February-April window
- Survey 70% of **each** grade, 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>
- E-mail a final copy of survey to project officer prior to implementation

# Community of Practice Call Summary – Security

## Mukwonago Security System:

- Integrating door locking system with surveillance cameras
- Able to be monitored and controlled through computer program
- Contributes to a better sense of safety
- Impact on tardiness and truancy

# Security Continued

- 20% of S3 grant funds can be used for security
  - Cap is arbitrary, based on past Safe and Drug Free Schools grant criteria
  - A higher amount may be negotiated based on individual high school's need

# Community of Practice Call Summary – Alternatives to Suspension

- Programs/interventions that are used to replace an in-school or out-of-school suspension.
  - restorative circles,
  - transition back from AODA violations
  - ISS
- Evaluation of these approaches
  - tracking rates/activities.
  - PBIS

# Challenges Identified-Alternatives to Suspension

- Off site ISS and link with special ed
- Rates/tracking of special ed students being suspended
- Policies that force suspension rather than prevention
- Lack of guidance/experience with these options
