Title of Training: Next Steps beyond Professional Development

Description of Training: A growing number of school districts are requesting additional professional development opportunities (that go beyond the traditional half-day or one-day trainings) designed to support schools' implementation of trauma-sensitive practices. This additional professional development may take different forms, depending upon the school's needs and priorities, and was designed to specifically meet this growing demand.

- External coaching provided for an internal coach leading a trauma-sensitive schools school-wide team implementing the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction Trauma-Sensitive Schools Learning Modules.
- Facilitation of a professional learning community focused on trauma-sensitive schools.
- Classroom coaching through observation and hands-on coaching to include one or more "co-coaches" from the school staff for continued development of internal expertise. A school specific template for a model classroom will be developed to be scaled up throughout the school.
- Consultation on strategic planning for implementation of trauma-sensitive practice at the leadership team level, examining and analyzing school district policy, procedure, environmental structure, discipline practice, etc.

Target Audience: General and special education teachers, student services staff, and administrators

Any Prerequisite Training or Knowledge: An introductory course on trauma-sensitive schools is necessary. Completion of the *Introduction to the Seven Essential Ingredients of a Trauma-Sensitive Schools* training is strongly encouraged before engaging additional professional development. Participants should have a foundational knowledge of the high prevalence of adverse experiences students in our schools may face and the impact this can have on development, behavior, and learning.

Time Frame: Based upon school/district needs and form of professional development selected from above.

Activities/Format: Active learning and practice, consultation, and coaching

Size of Audience: Based upon the form of professional development selected from above
