

**Title of Training:** 7ei of Trauma-Sensitive Schools – Train the Trainer

**Description of Training:** Participants will be trained in the 7 essential ingredients of trauma-sensitive schools model of practice over an intensive 4-day training. Participants will observe an introductory training with other participants to see how the trainer delivers content, responds to questions, and manages time. Participants will be given resources and readings to support understanding of the development of the model and be able to increase their own expertise to create trauma-sensitive schools in their district. The trainer will break down the training so that participants can learn each concept and develop ideas for application. The participants will have a chance to be observed training the curriculum and receive feedback and support.

**Learning Objectives**

1. Participants will learn the 7ei model of Trauma-Sensitive Schools.
2. Participants will learn about underlying research and information that supports the model.
3. Participants will gain confidence to present the material to their school or district colleagues.
4. Participants will have the knowledge and expertise to support the trauma-sensitive practice in their district.

**Target Audience:** General and special education teachers, student services staff, and administrators

**Any Prerequisite Training or Knowledge:** An introductory course on trauma-sensitive schools is necessary. Completion of the *Introduction to the Seven Essential Ingredients of a Trauma-Sensitive Schools* training is strongly encouraged before attending this course. Participants should have a foundational knowledge of the high prevalence of adverse experiences students in our schools may face and the impact this can have on development, behavior, and learning.

Participants will be given the curriculum and be certified to train in their home district or agency. Training at least two times per year is required to maintain certification. Recertification to give curriculum updates and new research will be required every two years at a significant cost reduction from initial certification and will take place over two days.

**Time Frame:** Training takes place over four consecutive days.

**Activities/Format:** Power point, small group activity and discussion, and video

**Size of Audience:** 10-30 participants
