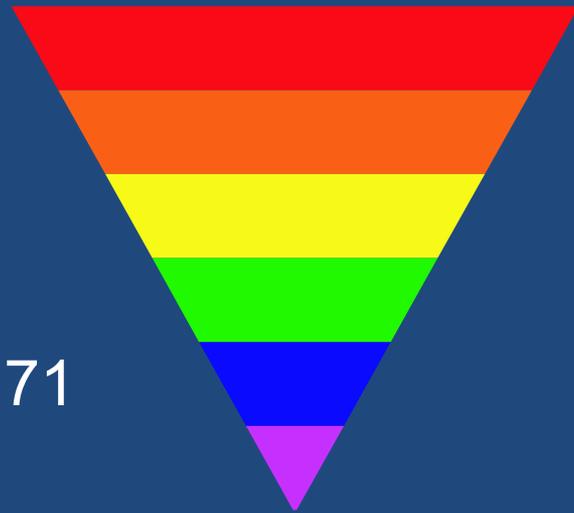

# Learning Objectives

## *Step In, Speak Up!*

01

Recognize the specific challenges of high-risk student populations such as LGBTQ students

04

Know when and how to ask a student if they are thinking about suicide



02

Promote a “safe space” for all students with effective classroom management techniques

03

Initiate a conversation with a student about sensitive topics, such as bullying

### ***Step In, Speak Up!*: Training for Educators on Supporting LGBTQ Youth**

- a classroom discussion, correcting the use of anti-gay language and addressing observed incidents of harassment
- a one-on-one talk with a student who has been harassed



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# How it Works



1 Assume the role of a teacher (or student) and engage in **virtual conversations**

2 Control the conversation by **choosing** what to say

3 Learn to use open-ended questions and **motivational interviewing** techniques

4 Receive **feedback** throughout that highlights important lessons and key strategies

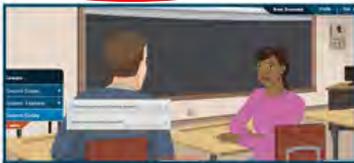

# Best Practices from Kognito

## What has worked in other schools?

Many schools have had great success getting everyone trained. Here are some ways they motivated staff to take it.



### Make it easy for staff.

- Swap out a regular **staff meeting** with one about supporting students, sharing why the training is important and how it can help them.
- Use time during an **in-service training** to introduce the training; provide the URL.
- Encourage staff to participate at a time that's most convenient for them, whether it's at home or at school, in a lab or at a desk - and **give them a deadline**.

### Incentives, incentives, incentives!



- Ask staff to print the certificate of completion and submit to be entered into a raffle to win modest gift cards or other rewards.
- Let those who have completed the training leave an in-service training an hour early.
- Have the principal extend personal congrats as grades or departments complete the training.



### Tell students and parents.

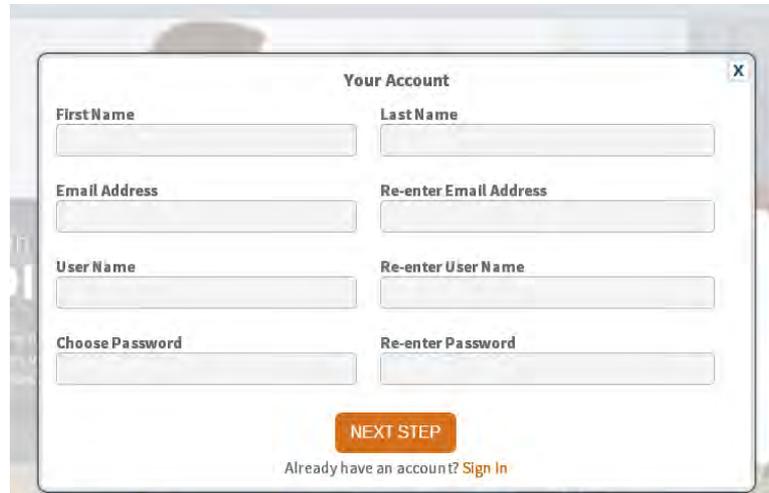
- Let students know who's been trained so they know who to talk to if they need help.
- Inform parents that your school is participating so they know about this new capacity among staff.
