Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction Wisconsin Academic Standards Review and Revision Checklist¹

In order to determine whether to 1) maintain the current Wisconsin standards <u>or</u> 2) undergo further review/revision and modify the Wisconsin standards, this checklist must be utilized. If the received public input is assessed against the policy/content checklist and the current standards are found adequate, no further review shall occur.

The results of the comparison below shall result in a 'yes' to modify the current standards, or a 'no' to maintain the current standards. The Wisconsin DPI has provided the criteria to provide transparency around this assessment. The Standards Review and Revision Checklist must be utilized once public feedback has been received on the need for revision. The results of this comparison would either require the Wisconsin standards to undergo revision, or determine that the standards remain in their current form.

Public feedback shall be sought for the content standards generally, but also specific content standards. In order to be considered, any public feedback must be relevant and substantive in nature. While helpful, impressions or general likes or dislikes concerning the standards or policies, will not be assessed in the checklist comparison.

The Standards Review Checklist is set out below.
