

What Can I Teach with my License Guidance – ESL, Bilingual/Bicultural, and World Languages

In Wisconsin, several types of Language Instruction Educational Programs are provided by our school districts. Sometimes there is confusion as to the appropriate license needed to teach within these programs. The purpose of this guidance is to provide clarity on the Wisconsin licenses, the types of language instruction educational programs a license holder may work within, and general information about the educator preparation requirements for these licenses.
