

Trade Specialist Permit Pathway

Candidate Profile

- -Seeking to teach upper level high school courses in the trade area of their training §118.19 (7) *industrial arts trade areas, since 1936*
- -Completed an apprenticeship program and 3 additional years of occupational experience in a particular trade area; or
- -Completed 4 years of institutional training in a trade area; or
- -Certified by the technical college system board to teach an industrial arts or similar subject



Trade Specialist Permit Pathway

Examples in this Pathway:

Permit	2010	2011	2012	2013	2014	Totals
Trade Specialist Permits Issued	11	11	10	9	9	50

- Upon completing a welding apprenticeship and working three years as a welder, a trade specialist permit can be issued to teach welding
- Upon completing 4 years of construction trades training at a college/ university, a trade specialist permit can be issued to teach construction
- A certified technical college architectural drafting instructor, may be issued a trade specialist permit to teach architectural drafting
