August 31	2014-15 Regular Term <a href="#">End-of-Year Report</a> due.
30 days after summer program ends	2015 Summer Term <a href="#">End-of-Year Report</a> due. (MEP grants only <u>not</u> Math MATTERS)
September 30	<a href="#">Continuing Enrollment Report (CER)</a> due. This is a good time to verify each student has a current COE on file.
30 days after summer program ends	Summer <a href="#">Student Reporting Forms (SRF)</a> due.
