## Technical Support

Universal Design for Learning (UDL) provides educators with a structure so that ALL students are able to access the curriculum, show what they know through meaningful assessment, and be engaged in their learning.

Now that you have attended a UDL overview, this may be your next step on your UDL implementation journey.

Participants will have opportunities to engage with other schools/districts about successes, challenges, lessons learned and resources that may provide direction as to where to go next. Opportunities will also be provided to reflect on how to connect UDL to current school improvement efforts. In addition, participants will leave with ideas on how to keep moving efforts forward.

Participants should bring a laptop or other wi-fi enabled device.


### Cost
