Resources used are STUDENT (Student details), STUDENTACADEMICRECORD (High School Completion information), STUDENTPROGRAM (program area inclusion, e.g. ELL, Migrant, etc.), STUDENTSCHOOL (Enrollment), STUDENTSCHOOLWISC (Wisconsin specific enrollment elements), STUDENTSPECIAL EDUCATION (details of a student's special education information).

Program Schedule and	Program Schedule is the schedule of the educational program in which a student is enrolled.
