

About WISEdash

WISEdash is the new statewide data warehouse system that provides all school districts with tools that allow authorized users to access dashboards and reports on a variety of topics. Multiple indicators of student learning and performance should be incorporated into analysis and decision-making at all levels including the classroom, school and district. WISEdash enables districts to access reports and dashboards—in a single location— on topics that draw from the WISE data warehouse.

The dashboards provided by DPI through WISEdash help build a better understanding of education performance and outcomes for students in your district and all of Wisconsin.

This is a secure release only. Log in is required and available only to school and district staff interested in accessing a variety of dashboards and reports populated with their school/district data.

The data and dashboards available include:

1. Enrollment and Attendance
2. Assessments (including WSAS, ACT, AP and ACCESS for ELL)
3. Student Growth Percentiles
4. High School Completion
5. Postsecondary Enrollment
6. Student Profile
7. Student Search

This is just the start for WISEdash. DPI has a long list of data and dashboards to incorporate into WISEdash in the future. Working collaboratively with the CSN, we look forward to collecting feedback from districts about how to continue to improve WISEdash for you. In addition to adding data and dashboards, the DPI has asked the CSN to lead a WISEdash Guided Analysis Workgroup (WISExplore) to produce professional development curriculum intended to guide districts in their data analysis. With a focus on blended professional development (i.e., face-to-face plus e-learning modules) this curriculum can fill the role of school improvement digital data retreats. The aim is to help educators and administrators make sense of the data they're seeing in order to facilitate a statewide culture of data-driven decision making. DPI and the CESAs will be providing more information about the professional development tools as the school year goes along.
