Every Student Succeeds Act Historical Overview



Historical Overview

1965 - Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

2002 - No Child Left Behind (NCLB)

2012 - ESEA Flexibility Waiver

2015 - Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)



Core Requirements

Many provisions pieces of the law are similar to or unchanged from No Child Left Behind

- Annual testing grades 3-8 and once in high school.
- The state must identify schools if they aren't meeting certain benchmarks.
- States must disaggregate test data by subgroups.

- States and schools must make available school performance information annually.
- Private schools are entitled to services allocated from school district federal funds.
- States must look at and address the distribution of teachers.
- Homeless student provisions continue to apply under McKinney Vento.



Other New ESSA Requirements

- Performance information for military
 and foster care students
- Foster care liaison
- School Level Financial Reporting
- Private School Ombudsman and additional Equitable Participation Provisions

- English learner entrance and exit criteria
- Cap on alternate assessments for special education students
- Assessments provided in other languages
- Basic learning grant (Title IV Part A)




Deadlines & Process

Assurances: Due April 3, 2017

State Plan Template: Due Sept. 18, 2017

Key Timeline Considerations:

- Submission Date: Sept. 18
- Required minimum 30 day public review of plan.
- Required minimum 30 day review by Governor.
- DPI will revise the plan based on public, stakeholder, legislative, and gubernatorial input.



Note: The effective date for the final regulations was postponed from January to March 21, 2017; however, they are likely to be repealed via the Congressional Review Act (which as already passed the U.S. House).

Stakeholder Engagement

- Listening sessions (summer 2016) open to anyone
- Additional meetings with specific groups
- State Superintendent's Equity in ESSA Council
- Online input forms/surveys
- Plans for future meetings, future surveys



DPI's ESSA Timeline

 Wisconsin plans to submit its state plan September 18. ESSA Planning Timeline

 A draft plan will be available for public review and comment by May.

The Department of Public Instruction will work to insulate local districts and schools from this uncertainty at the federal level.

ESSA Accountability Systems

What's the same for accountability?

- Assessment requirements
- Achievement, growth, graduation measures
- Performance goals

What's new?

- No reference to district accountability reporting
- Improvement in English language proficiency
- Specific mention of "other indicators" (school quality, student success

What's up for discussion?

What new indicators might we consider adding to report cards?



ESSA Requires a New Data Element

Engagement

College & Career Readiness

Climate & Safety

This may include these measures:

student engagement educator engagement

student access to and completion of advanced coursework

postsecondary readiness

suspension & expulsion (discipline data)

bullying, harassment, crime data, etc. Or.... we use absenteeism, which is already collected as part of the State Report Card System.

Things to Consider

Measures

What data should we include in accountability?

Metrics

How should we include it?

Intended/unintended consequences

How might including this measure in this way change behavior?



Accountability under ESSA: Strict Flexibility

State and federal requirements impact the design and implementation of accountability systems.

These requirements create opportunities

- To incorporate measures that represent what a state values in education (e.g., college and career indicators)
- To think creatively about how to implement a specific requirement

They also create challenges

- When the requirement is counter to the intent of the system
- When the requirement adds undue complexity



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Every Student Succeeds Act Data Collection and Reporting



ESSA Data Collection and Reporting

- Not too much has changed.
- Some new data elements:
 - Foster care status
 - Children of active military personnel
 - Postsecondary enrollment
- Some new ways to collect data (e.g., per-pupil funding at a school level instead of district level)
- DPI is working to collect these data for districts
