Federal Funding Options

Title I Schoolwide

- In general, covers all costs

Title I Targeted

- Only costs associated with providing services to students qualifying for Title I services

IDEA Entitlement

- Only costs associated with providing services to students eligible for special education services

CEIS (IDEA)

- Limited allowed costs associated with the delivery of interventions

Title I Schoolwide Set-Aside (IDEA)

- In general, covers all costs

Entitlement funds under IDEA are awarded on a noncompetitive basis for programs and services to students with disabilities

Preschool (PS)

Provides funds for special education services to children ages 3 to 5

Flow-through (FT)

Provides funds for special education services to children ages 3 to 21

Types of IDEA Entitlement Grants

Flow-through Entitlement & Reading



LEAs may choose to use IDEA flow-through or preschool to fund a reading teacher (with a 360 license) to provide specially designed literacy instruction outlined in a student's IEP.

- The cost is not eligible for state categorical special education aid
- Appropriate time and effort documentation would need to be maintained
- Cost would be coded to Fund 27

IDEA Title-I Schoolwide Set-Aside



- Section 613(a)(2)(D) of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act
- Schoolwide programs under Title I of the Elementary & Secondary Education Act (34 CFR § 300.206)
- An LEA may use funds received under Part B of the Act for any fiscal year to carry out a schoolwide program under section 1114 of the ESEA

Allowable Expenditures

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- Activities that support the district's approved action strategies as outlined in the ESEA consolidated application's program plan
- Any manner the LEA chooses as long as the costs are allowed under the Uniform Grant Guidance
 - Salaries / Fringe
 - Contracted Costs
 - Curriculum Development / Materials / Software
 - Instructional Equipment

Funding RDA Focused - Activities



The following RDA activities are usually already covered by the District's approved action strategies:

- Continuously monitoring student progress data and adjusting instruction
- Ensuring high-quality, standards-based curriculum and instruction
- Facilitating collaboration among general and special educators
- Implementing Universal Design Learning
- Infusing cultural responsiveness
- Using multi-level systems of support



What's the catch?

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- The LEA must have approved Title I schoolwide schools to participate
- Funds must be expended at the school level

Title I Schoolwide Set-Aside & Special Education



Students attending the Title I schoolwide school in which IDEA funds are used for schoolwide activities, must continue to receiving special education and related services in accordance with properly developed IEPs

Supplement / Not Supplant



 Definition: Replacing previously existing costs with federal dollars

- For special education, there is no supplement / not supplant provision with IDEA funds <u>if</u> an LEA is meeting maintenance of effort requirements
 - Since these are technically special education funds, the supplement/not supplant rules apply to the set-aside rather than the supplement / not supplant rules of the Title I-A program

TI Set-Aside & Flow-through

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Each LEA will need to address/discuss concerns that IDEA funds are being spent on regular education activities as opposed to special education activities

- With a strong multi-level system of support in place, LEAs should see a decrease in the number of students identified as needing special education programming
- Results Drive Accountability Literacy this flexibility could support LEAs looking for ways to strengthen the general education instruction for students with disabilities

FY 2014-15 Application Process



- Any time between July 1 and June 30
- Submitted through the IDEA flow-through budget
- Ability to budget for this option is only available to LEAs with Title I schoolwide schools
- One budget entry per school (and just one)

WISEgrants Application Process



- Collect Title I Schoolwide school student with disabilities enrollment numbers for the Title I Schoolwide set-aside
- Reserve funds for Title I Schoolwide activities
- Budget and claim for these costs separate from the flow-through budget
- Budget items will be identified by school

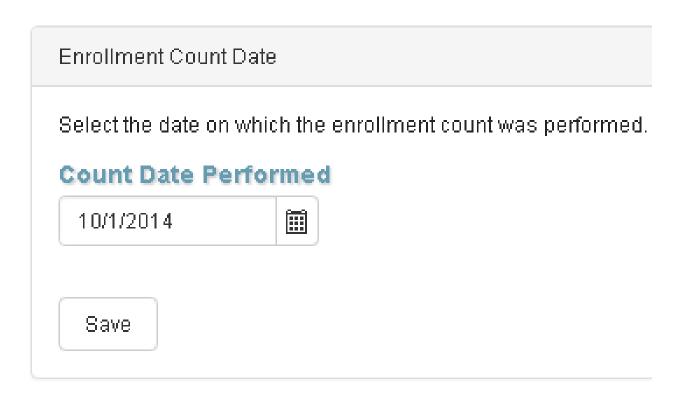

Step 1 – Title I Schoolwide Set-Aside Process

 Report the date count was taken (is supposed to be current year, but can use estimates for planning purposes, but must be updated with actuals when the count is known)



Step 2 – Enter Total Student with Disabilities Enrollment

• Include all students with disabilities in the district, ages 3 to 21, attending both public and private schools

Step 3 – Enter Students with Disabilities Enrolled in the Title I Schoolwide School

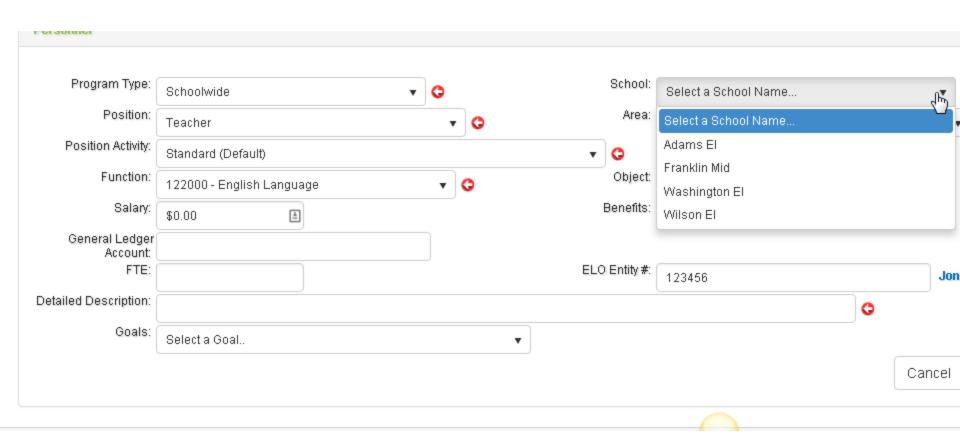

Step 5 – Budget for expenditures at the Title I Schoolwide School level





Costs will be tracked at the school level

A Title I Schoolwide Set-Aside budget cannot be submitted if budgeted amounts exceed the school's reserved or maximum set-aside amounts

CEIS



Stands for "Coordinated Early Intervening Services"

- Up to 15% of IDEA Allocation Option for **ALL** LEAs
- Supports and services for students who need academic or behavioral help to succeed in general education but who have not been identified as students with disabilities
- The intent is that IDEA funds for CEIS supplement a district's support for providing a system of interventions

What is CEIS?



• Most districts have the option to reserve and budget up to 15% of their IDEA funds for a CEIS set-aside

 Some districts are required to use 15% of their IDEA funds on a CEIS set-aside because of findings made by DPI

The Caveat



- Not intended for students with disabilities
- Interventions funded with CEIS dollars must be provided to non-disabled students <u>identified</u> as needing additional academic and behavioral supports to succeed in general education.
- Intended for grades kindergarten (including 4K) through grade 12, with emphasis on the early grades
 - But <u>NOT</u> allowed for preschool

Funding an RtI System with CEIS



- A district's <u>coordinated</u> system for...
 - Identifying students at-risk for failure (screening)
 - Providing the identified students with academic and/or behavioral services and supports
 - Monitoring the identified students' response to the services and supports (progress monitoring) and using the students' data to make educational decisions
 - Ensuring staff implementing these activities have received sufficient professional development and training

Not all of the CEIS pieces can be funded with CEIS grant dollars

Universal Screening



- Identifying students at risk for failure
 - Not random selection must be "data-based"
 - System for universal screening in place
 - Students may be at risk academically or because of behavior issues
- Universal screening activities used to identify students cannot be funded with CEIS dollars

Interventions

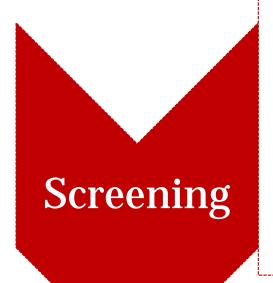


- Providing the <u>identified</u> students with academic and/or behavioral services and supports
 - Often referred to as "interventions"
 - Not core curriculum or "differentiated" curriculum
 - **▼ CEIS cannot fund Universal Learning Design initiatives**
 - Staff that provide these services and supports must be qualified and appropriately licensed
- Activities to provide interventions can be funded with CEIS dollars

Monitoring of Interventions



- Monitoring the identified students' response to the services and supports
 - Data is collected on individual student response to the services and supports (interventions)
 - Response is monitored frequently and regularly
 - Monitoring data is used for making decisions about whether interventions are helping and if continued intervention is needed
- Monitoring of intervention activities can be funded with CEIS dollars



- General education classroom teachers administer Brand X Math Screener in 6th grade and record results
- All students screened (60), 12 students are identified
- Cannot use CEIS funds

- The identified 12 students receive after school math tutoring from the mathematics teacher
- Not "drop-in"
- May use CEIS funds

Intervention



- Brand X Math probe administered bi-weekly to the 12 identified students by the mathematics teacher
- Data analysis: If insufficient improvement, add extra intervention session or modify intervention
- May use CEIS funds

Professional Development

- All middle school math teachers are trained in the Brand X math intervention curriculum and the Brand X math progress monitoring tool
- May use CEIS funds

CEIS and Special Education



- If a referral for special education is made, a special education evaluation must be initiated
- Data collected as part of a district's CEIS activities may be used when considering if a student meets SLD criteria (specific learning disability)
- Students receiving special education services must have access to general education services, including general education academic and behavioral interventions (as determined by the IEP team)

Examples of CEIS Allowable Costs



Staff:

- General education teachers and substitute teachers
- School Psychologists, Social Workers, Guidance Counselors, School Nurses
- Program Coordinator
- Coaches for Staff
- Mentors
- Tutors / Aides
 - Under the supervision of appropriately licensed staff
 - Not meant for "drop-in" tutoring sessions

Examples of CEIS Allowable Costs



Purchased Services:

- Aides / Tutors
- Coaches for Staff
- Copying / Printing / Records
- Curriculum Development
- Professional Development / Travel
- Substitute Teachers
- Travel

Examples of CEIS Allowable Costs



Non-Capital Objects:

- General Supplies
- Instructional Materials
- Instructional Media (Software)
- Non-Capital Equipment (limited)
- Non-Instructional Software
- Student Incentives

Professional Development



CEIS may pay for professional development to

SUPPLEMENT

implemented interventions in the year funds are used

If using CEIS funds, an LEA <u>must</u> provide interventions to identified students

Reporting Requirements



- If a district uses IDEA funds for CEIS, then the district must report <u>annually</u> the students that received services funded with CEIS dollars
 - There are no exceptions if funds are claimed, there must be a student count for that year
- DPI reports to the US Department of Education, annually, the number of students who received CEIS and then consequently qualify for special education services within the next two years

Planning Phase



- Complete the CEIS narrative:
 - **▼** Is there a universal screener in place?
 - **▼** How will students receiving CEIS services be identified?
 - ★ Who will collect the student data?
 - **▼** How will the other pieces of the RtI system be funded?
 - **▼** Where will the CEIS funds be spent?
 - ➤ How will this coordinate with other district plans?

Applying for CEIS Funds



- Accessed through the Special Education Web Portal
- CEIS is a "budget within a budget" located in the IDEA flow-through entitlement
- Although CEIS is part of the entitlement funding, it is budgeted and claimed separately in Fund 10
- The "max" CEIS available identified in the budget software is the 15% cap on set-aside
 - If all flow-through entitlement budgeted, no funds are available for CEIS

CEIS Carryover



A district has 27 months to expend a CEIS set-aside

If the district budgets \$15,000 for CEIS but only expends \$10,000 in FY 2014-15; then the district has the option of setting aside a new amount for FY 2015-16 in addition to the unspent \$5,000 from FY 2014-15

CEIS Narrative



- Required; Given the same thorough review as the CEIS budget
- Describes the LEA's plan for using funds under the CEIS set-aside
 - District's must provide a description of the activities needed to implement screening, interventions, and progress monitoring
 - The narrative includes only the pieces of an RtI System that will be funded in part with CEIS

- HOWEVER cannot supplant Title funds with CEIS
 - Not just Title, any federal funds

TI Set-Aside & CEIS



- An LEA may utilize both the CEIS and Title I Schoolwide set-asides; however –
- The amount of IDEA funds that may be expended on general education by a Title I Schoolwide school is capped at the amount that can be set aside under this provision
 - If a school is allowed to set aside and expend up to \$10,000 under the Title I Schoolwide set-aside, it may not also use additional funds set-aside under CEIS
